<p>1. Authority 20 U.S.C. §6391; et seq. 34 CFR 200.81- 200.88</p>	<p>The Board establishes a program to address the needs and provide appropriate services to migratory children attending district schools.</p>
<p>2. Definition 20 U.S.C. §6399(2) 34 CFR 200.81</p>	<p>“Migratory Child” means a child who is, or whose parent, spouse, or guardian is, a migratory agricultural worker, including a migratory dairy worker, or a migratory fisher, and who, in the proceeding 36 months, in order to obtain, or accompany such parent, spouse or guardian, in order to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work –</p> <p>(A) has moved from one school district to another;</p> <p>(B) in a State that is comprised of a single school district, has moved from one administrative area to another within such district; or</p> <p>(C) resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity.</p>
<p>3. Guidelines</p>	<p>The district program for migratory children attending district schools (“migrant students”) shall include procedures to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Identify migrant students and assess their educational and related health and social needs. (See Board policy form 142.1).</li> <li>2. Ensure migrant students have the appropriate educational opportunities to meet the same academic standard required of all students.</li> <li>3. Provide a full range of service to migrant students including applicable Title I programs, special education, gifted education, vocational education, language programs, counseling programs and elective classes.</li> <li>4. Provide parents an opportunity for meaningful participation in the program.</li> </ol>

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<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>5. Provide advocacy and outreach programs for migrant students and their families.</p> <p>6. Provide professional development for district staff.</p> <p>The Superintendent , or his or her designee, shall develop procedures to notify and involve parents in the development, implementation and evaluation of the district's program for migrant students.</p>
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
