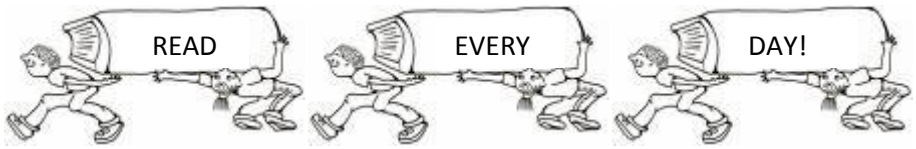


Title I Tidbits...

Looks like everyone is ready for summer! All of our Title I students have worked hard this year! We hope that everyone has a safe and relaxing summer! Every student needs to read over the summer and keep their skills sharp! Your child has learned hundreds of words this year alone. Without reading those newly learned words will be lost! As always, reading to your child is so very rewarding for your child. Please see the back for information regarding our summer resources available in the office at PLE.

I recommend that your child keep a journal of some type over the summer that they can write in daily. They can record a plan for their day or a retelling of their favorite part of their day. Head to the library and find some wordless books. Have your child write a story to match the illustrations.

While you are at the Library be sure to have your child pick books that are of interest to them! If your child loves sharks, find as many shark books as you can! Your child will be more motivated to read if the book interests them! Keep in mind the five finger rule. If your child struggles to read more than five words on a page or two, then that book might be better read by a parent or as a team.

Play word games all summer long. Give your child a word and ask them to say the word without the beginning sound. For example, say bat without the /b/...at. Go further by having your child add /m/ to the beginning of at to get mat. This word game can be played with numerous words.

Be sure to let your child see you read too! Make it a family affair by turning off the television for 20 minutes a day. Twenty minutes a day will add up over the summer. If your child reads for 20 minutes a day for every day of summer vacation, by the time your child returns to school on August 30th they would have read for 24 hours...**an entire day!**

Good luck to all of our second graders moving on to AGI! Remember to use your strategies as you read, read, read! I look forward to seeing all the first graders in the second grade in August!

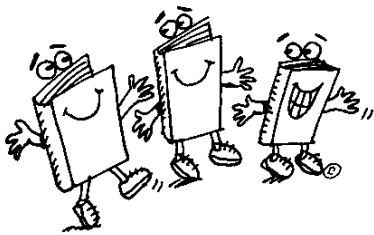
Summer Resources
